

CLASS HISTORY

We, like other Senior classes that have gone out before us, take great pleasure in revealing the happenings and events of the past four years. We recall many pleasant incidents that have made history for us.

In September 1950, 76 boys and girls entered high school, taking their places as green Freshmen with Mrs. Euna Mac Hicks as their sponsor. Chosen for our class officers were: Linda Stephenson, president; Peggy Brannon, vice-president; Claudene Moore, secretary; and Joyce Clark, treasurer. Our class was well represented in the different school activities. This was the first year the Lone Oak Basketball Queen was chosen from a Freshman class. Jean Peyton Morris was our Queen. Peggy Evans Herndon was a cheerleader for the Varsity team. Linda Stephenson and Peggy Brannon represented our class on the Junior League Cheering Squad. Fifteen of our boys were on the Junior League.

The next year we were very important, having passed that green Freshman year and entering the Sophomore year. We still had our 76 members, guided by Mrs. Hoyt Owen. We chose Randal Robinson as our president; Linda Stephenson as vice-president; Claudene Moore as secretary, and Harold Reed as treasurer. Our class took part in the various school events: Tri-Hi-Y, Beta Club, F. H. A., F. F. A., and the music clubs. Randal Robinson was made an Eagle Scout that year and Claudene Moore was our attendant in the Queen Crowning. Peggy Evans Herndon and Sue Carney Thompson were representatives from our class as varsity cheerleaders, and Dicky Anderson was assistant manager for the ball team. The superlatives chosen from our class were Peggy Brannon, Linda Stephenson, and Peggy Evans Herndon.

In 1952, we entered our Junior year losing only three members. We enjoyed this year very much, living up to our title of Jolly Juniors. This year Randal Robinson was chosen president; Peggy Brannon, vice-president; Claudene Moore, secretary, and Sarah Ward, treasurer. Our sponsors were Miss June Robinson and Mrs. Jimmy Small. Alton Yates, Sarah Ward, Charles Dykes, Randal Robinson, Peggy Brannon and Peggy Evans Herndon were the superlatives from the class. Sarah Ward was Junior attendant for Queen, and also Lieutenant Governor at Kentucky Girls' State. There were ten Juniors in the Dramatic Club, and Barbara Sullivan Buchanan, Larry Harris, and Caryl Pope were members of the speech class. Alton Yates was elected Governor of Bluegrass Boys' State, and also attended Boys' Nation. Four boys were selected for the varsity ball team and Linda Stephenson, Sue Carney Thompson, and Peggy Evans Herndon were cheerleaders from the Junior class. Linda Stephenson received a State Homemakers Degree and Alton Yates, Sarah Ward, Mary Sue Campbell, and Marianna Sims received medals for outstanding school work. This year we presented our Junior play, A DATE WITH JUDY, and sold magazines in order to entertain the 1953 graduating class at a banquet at the Irvin Cobb Hotel.

For three long years, we have looked forward to this, our Senior Year. At last we have reached our goal, even though it hardly seems possible that we could be Seniors. Under the guidance of Mrs, Mary North and Mrs. Mary Beth Bickers, this has been a year full of activity. This year, again, the members of our class have been under the leadership of Randal Robinson, our class president. Peggy Brannon was our vice-president, Claudene Moore, secretary; Linda Stephenson, treasurer. The Journalism class has been busy in the editing of the Oak "K," and in the preparation of the "Senior Spotlight." GOWN OF GLORY, which was presented May 28, was our Senior play. We were proud of our Senior representation on the Flash squad this year. Randal Robinson, Vernon Giltner, David Glisson, Alton Yates, Lee Roy Hayden, and Charles Dykes were among the first 10. Our team had the honor of going to the Regional Tournament at Murray. Also, Linda Stephenson, Peggy Brannon, Ruth Allen and Sarah Ward were four out of the five Varsity cheerleaders. Sarah Ward received a State Homemakers Degree in F. H. A. Harold Reed was accepted at Annapolis Naval Academy.
