Journalism Class Makes News

The Oak "K" has a new look this year. Have you noticed the different printing on the paper's name and the type of paper it is printed on? The journalism class, under the sponsorship of Mrs. Landa Nagel, is responsible for publishing your paper and for giving it this new look.

Much work is done preparatory to getting a school paper to its readers. After the story ideas are brought in, the editors must decide upon which page a story will be printed and who will write the story. When all the stories are written and the pictures are taken, the editors again return to work for they must write all of the headlines and picture captions. Along with the above copy, the staff sends down all advertisements. These ads, which help to pay for our paper, are sold and written up by the business and advertising staff.

The printer makes two copies of each story and sends them to us. The staff reads these copies to find and correct any errors, puts the stories on the pages as they should go, and returns the pages to the printer. He then "sets up" the paper and after being checked once more, it is printed ready to be given to you.
