Library . . .

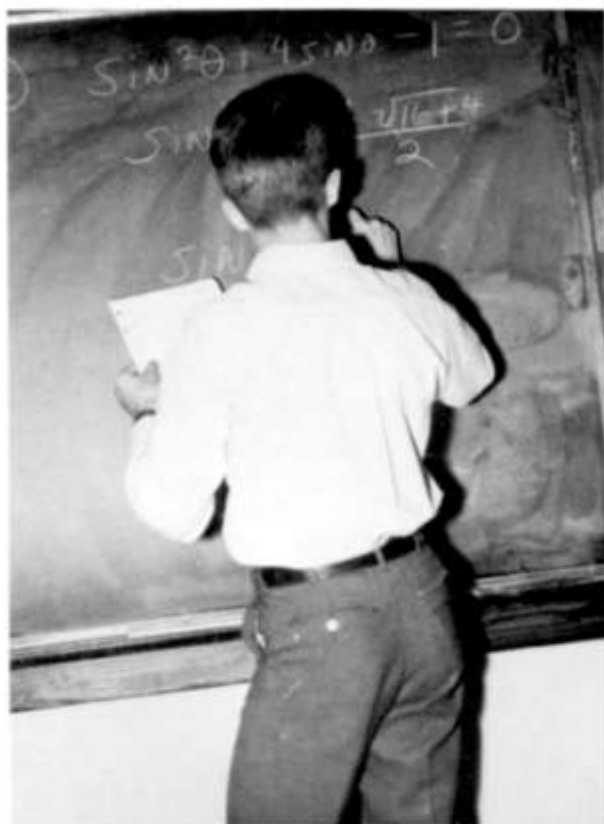

Math Tournament

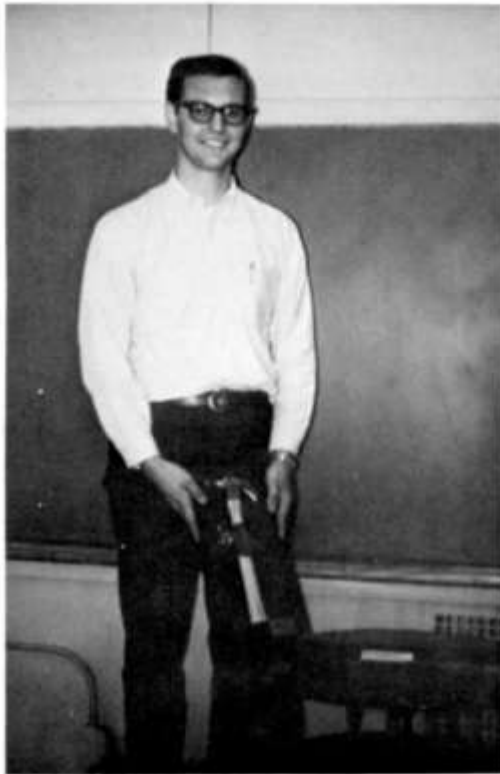

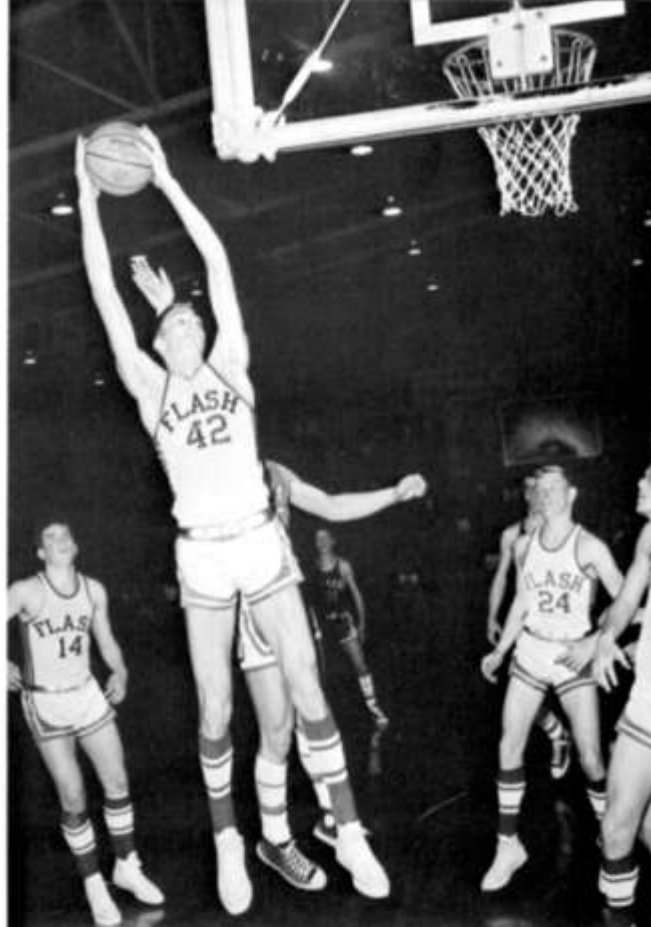

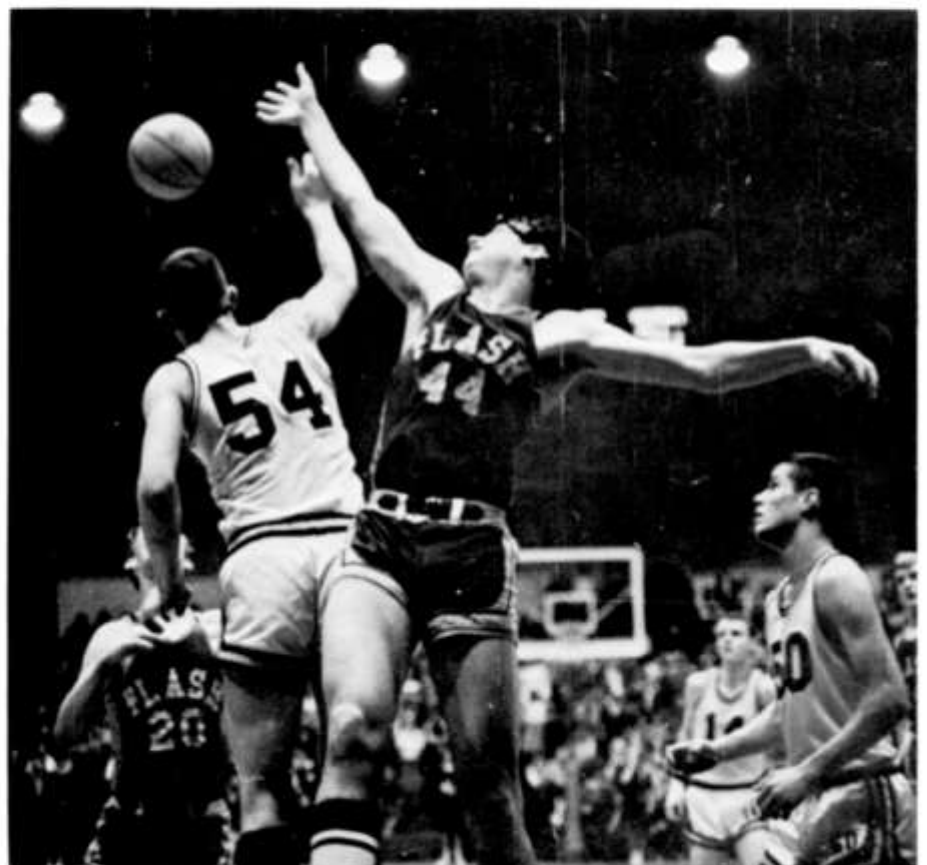
