Teresa Lanham And Joe Turner Are Selected Valedictorian, Salutatorian

Hard work has earned two Senior students the high honors of Valedictorian and Salutatorian. They are respectively, Teresa Lanham and Joe Turner. Both have had to work hard during their four years of high school to maintain a high enough average to receive such high honors. They will be recognized on graduation night when they will address the graduating seniors and the guests.

Throughout her four years of high school, Teresa has established a grade point average of 3.96. Her class schedules have included English-three years, history-two years, science-one year, biology and advanced biology, and chemistry. She also has taken geometry-one year, Algebra II, advanced math, psychology, and government, health occupations, P.E. and health, and Careers III. She has been a member of the choir one and a half years and band four years.

Along with her academic subjects, Teresa has been very active in extra-curricular activities also. She was a member of Tri-Hi-Y three years and attended KUNA two years, Music Club one year, Beta Club two years where she served as secretary. This year he received the honor of a letter of commendation for his high scores on his PSAT test. Next year Joe plans to attend PCC where he will major in math. He plans to use his major to possibly become a mathematical engineer.

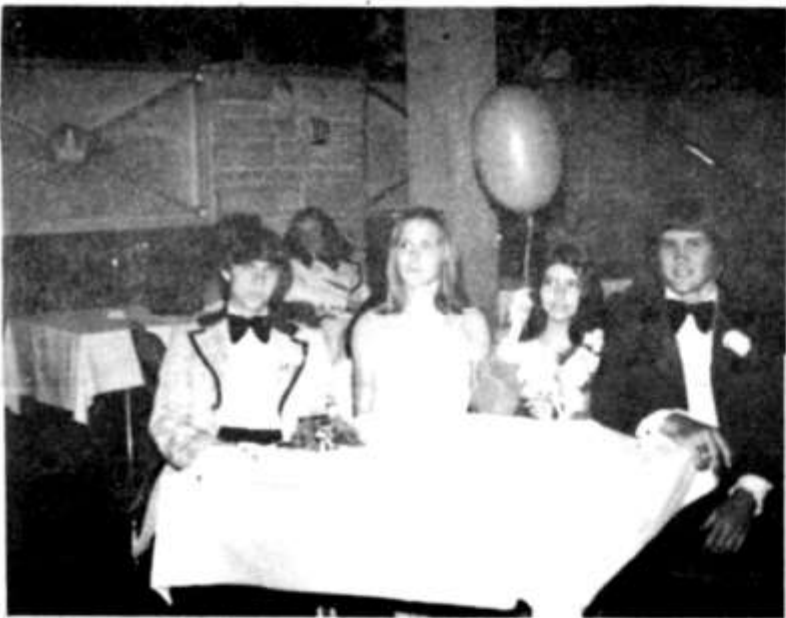
Scenes From Prom 1974
