A Flash Of Varsity Victory

The Lone Oak Varsity football team had a very successful season. Even though the record doesn't show it, this was undoubtedly the best team Lone Oak has ever seen.

Practice started July 23, with long, hard sessions under the hot sun. For the first time, the team went away to camp. The place: Dawson Springs, on August 5-10. It was a week of pain and suffering, with a few delectable meals thrown in between practices and scrimmage games. All in all, however, it was a week that pulled the team together, making it like a close-knit, proud family.

The season started out better than ever with a 28-0 win over Ballard Co. on August 24. The following two weeks brought crushing defeats from Tilghman on August 31 (18-8), and Heath on September 7 (6-0). The Flash has seven participants on the All-County team, six on the All WKC (Western Kentucky Conference) team, three All-State Honorable Mentions, and gave out two new awards in addition to the original four. 
At the close of the 1984-85 season, the track team had a lot to be proud of. Boy's and girl's teams both made great accomplishments.
