The long-awaited night has finally arrived. Tonight, after the seniors receive their diplomas, the Fellowship of

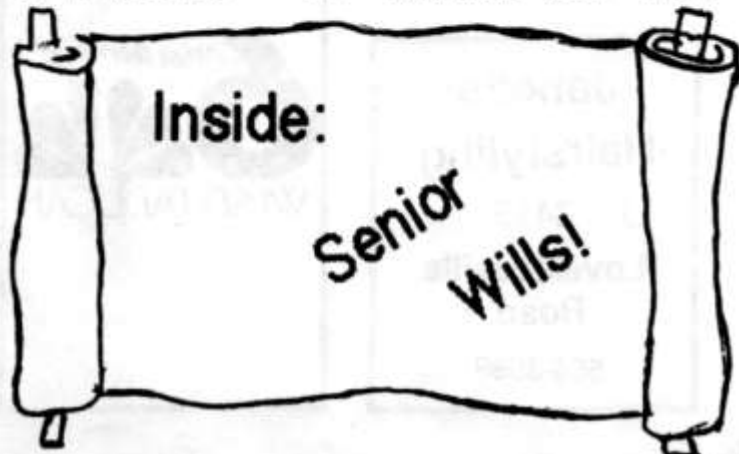
Christian Athletes will sponsor the second annual Project Graduation at Lone Oak High School. More than 95 percent of the seniors, with their

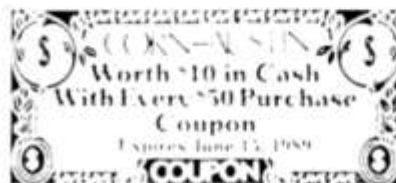
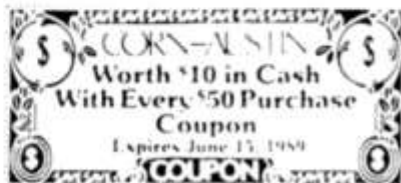
